## P.E. and Sport Premium Funding Policy

### 1. Aims

At Winnersh Primary School, we already provide a well-balanced, enjoyable and inspiring PE curriculum which encourages children to become physically active, boosts their confidence and provides them with opportunities to develop life skills. They experience a broad range of sporting opportunities that are challenging and inclusive of all abilities.

We recognise that a positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can build a lifetime habit of participation. Ensuring that our pupils have access to sufficient daily activity also has wider benefits such as improving behaviour and supporting academic achievement.

The broad aims of this funding are:

- i. To increase the quality of teaching and learning in PE and to broaden the range of sporting activities available to children.
- ii. To increase the provision of competitive opportunities for all children.
- iii. To support additional extra-curricular activities provided before school, after school and at lunch and break times.

### 2. Funding Arrangements

Schools receive their PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10.00 per pupil.

The Department of Education reviews the continuation of the grant on an annual basis.

### 3. Objectives

Winnersh Primary School will publish annual objectives and an impact statement on its website.

### 4. Swimming

The three requirements for swimming and water safety are that by the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6), children should be able to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- Use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.
- Perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

The school is able to use the PE and Sport Premium to train staff to support high quality swimming and water safety lessons for its pupils.

Schools are required to publish information about the percentage of pupils in Year 6 who met each of the three National Curriculum requirements.



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### 5. Equalities

We note that we are required to have due regard to the public sector equality duty under Section 149 (1) Equality Act 2010 when exercising our function. We do not consider any issues which arise from this policy would have any negative impacts on equality and we have considered appropriately the need to advance equality and foster good relations.

We acknowledge that for some children who have physical or medical difficulties, adaptations to our provision will be required. We review each child's needs and ensure that we support him/her with appropriate resources and differentiated activities. This is usually discussed and recorded as part of the child's Care Plan.
